God has never left himself without witnesses. When one speaks of Cuba, it is hardly in terms of the Church. More often than not it is about Communism and Castro and the 50 year embargo imposed by the United States of America on that country. Persons wherever they live and exist always yearn for a Supreme Being. God truly moves in a mysterious way for there were persons in Cuba who read about the Moravian Church and who fell in love with how it started and developed. In particular, it's Mission emphasis and the August 13th 1727 Holy Ghost Revival movement that started the 100 year unbroken prayer meeting. They prayed for the day when they would be able to commune with other Moravians and see it being established in Cuba.

Some years ago when the CCC had a Conference in Cuba contact was made with Moravians in the group and from that initial contact things have blossomed to what we now have as the Moravian Church in Cuba. This was not by accident; it was the Lord's doing. The Moravian Church in Jamaica being the closest in proximity to Cuba was asked to assume the responsibility to work with and develop the work there.

The Moravian Church is presently in various places in Havana and in the Province of Holquin. They do not have any buildings so they are primarily Home Churches and are growing very fast. There are (5) five groups in Havana with a membership of (116) one hundred and sixteen persons. The five groups are located in the following areas:

- a. Belen in Playa
- b. The light of the World in Mariano
- Christ the Saviour of the World in Old Havana
- d. El Amigo in East Havana and
- e. Betania in Cerro

In the Province of Holquin a number of persons from the Lutheran Church joined the Moravians and they have established themselves in (3) three locations. The total membership in Holquin Province is (125) one hundred and twenty five. The Fellowships established are:

- a. Christ the King and Emmanuel in Holquin
- b. Prince of Peace in the rual community of Tomi
- c. Maranatha in Floro Perez

In Havana as in Holquin, the work has advanced through the instrumentality of the Holy Spirit and the dedication of the brothers and sisters who have a longing and desire for God. With the exception of the fellowship in Tomi, all of the other fellowships meet in Homes.

As the Moravian Church in Cuba thrives and survives it should be it should be a good model to follow with the development of the cell group of house church.

There are presently (3) three Cuban ordained Pastors and one student for ministry at UTCWI in Jamaica.

The Mount Tabor Moravian Congregation in Barbados has taken up the mission challenge of sponsoring one of the Pastors in Cuba. This is a commendable effort by this congregation and we give God Thanks for the willingness to allow themselves to be used by God in this way.

Let us challenge ourselves and pray for the expansion and growth of the Moravian Church.

Bethesda - "House of mercy or House of grace":

28 April 1819

Celebrating 190 years under the theme,

"Rededicating our lives for God's service."

In 1796, John Renatus Verbeck from the Unity Elders Conference arrived in St Kitts and on a visit to Cayon decided to establish a station there. At that time, there were already 500 converts of the Moravian Church living there. However, it was not until 1819 that a foundation for a mission house was laid. As

membership increased, it became necessary to have a place of worship. By December 1819, the mission house was used as a place of worship, although incomplete.

The foundation stone for the church was laid on 1 March 1820 and it was dedicated on 27 February 1821. The first resident missionaries were Brother and Sister Christian F Kaltophen. Under their leadership, the membership increased to 874.

From the very beginning, to educate its members was one of the goals of the Moravian congregations. Classes had already begun in the church for over 100 students and in January 1838, the congregation drew plans for building a school. It was built adjacent to the Church. The School was officially opened on 11 June 1839 and by 1894, there was a total enrollment of 294 students.

In 1914, because of financial constraints, the school was turned over to the Government. The Schoolroom is no longer used full time by the government, the Church, however continues to give support in education, and up to present day the schoolroom is used as an examination center.

Over the 190 years, 54 missionaries/ministers have walked through the doors of Bethesda as shepherd of the flock, beginning with the Kaltophens and presently Rev Nasel W Y Ephraim – all with the same vision – to see the Church grow and move from strength to strength.

St. Maarten Sanctuary Dedication

The St. Maarten Moravian Church will dedicate its new sanctuary on Mothers Day 2009 (May 10). Prior to Easter Sunday 2009 (April 12), the place of worship was the St. Peter Methodist Church building. The prayers and support of the people of God are requested for the Church in St. Maarten, that it will be a beacon of hope as it seeks to make Jesus known in that country.
