### **How we live affects others**

As humans we are inherently social beings, created to live in community. As a result, how we live and what we do can and does affect others. The Apostle Paul, in his letter to the church in Rome, spoke to this very thing where he urged those who were eating certain types of food, to be conscious of the negative impact it was having on others, and therefore to desist from doing so, that they who had a weaker conscience would not be caused to stumble. So then each of us shall give account of himself to God. *Therefore let us not judge one another anymore, but rather resolve this, not to put a stumbling block or a cause to fall in our brother's way. (Romans 14: 12,13)* It should be noted that there was nothing illegal in what was being eaten.

With COVID-19 around, we too are being called to curb certain activities and behaviour for the good of the community – serving to emphasise the fact that we are indeed our brother's and sister's keeper. There is an African word of Zulu origin, “unbuntu”, which loosely translates as “I am because we are”. It captures the essence of our inter-connectedness as a community and the need for us to serve each other. Although this is very apparent in the current environment, it should be noted that this is an everyday reality. As a Christian community, we therefore have the duty to live responsibly towards our brothers, our sisters, and the wider community, following the example set by our Lord Jesus, remembering that in the end we are accountable to HIM. As the old adage goes, “a chain is as strong as the weakest link”. May we therefore, as a community, be mindful and supportive of the vulnerable and weak amongst us so that at the end of this crisis we may all be found to be standing strong – “I am because We are”.

Be blessed, stay safe, and remember to live responsibly.

### Provincial Elders' Conference Prayer Call – March 1, April 1, May 1, June 1

All persons are asked to spend some time during the day in reflection and prayer. See Prayer Guide using Scripture:

#### 1. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GOD AND HIS GREATNESS

- There is none like You, O LORD; You are great, and great is Your name in might ([Jeremiah 10:6](#)). For great are You LORD, and greatly to be praised; You are to be feared above all gods ([1 Chronicles 16:25](#)). Yours, O LORD, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the victory and the majesty, indeed everything that is in the heavens and the earth; Yours is the dominion, O LORD, and You exalt Yourself as head over all ([1 Chronicles 29:11](#)). For You, the Mighty One, have done great things ([Luke 1:49](#)).
  - a. God as Head of the Church*
  - b. Pray that every pastor, leader, committee member submit to God's authority.*

#### 2. CONFESSION OF SIN

- Whoever conceals their sins does not prosper, but the one who confesses and renounces them finds mercy, so I come confessing all sins ([Proverbs 28:13](#)) that would hinder my communication with You. I acknowledge my sins to You and do not cover up my iniquity. I confess my transgressions to You Lord and I thank You for the forgiveness of the guilt of my sin ([Psalm 32:5](#)). ## Sunday School Workshop – Our Pastorate

On Saturday, February 29, 2020 a Sunday School Workshop was held for the Bethlehem and Faith congregations at Bethlehem. Present were Rev. Roslyn Hamblin, Pastor David Ince (Facilitator), Rev. Julie Joefield Parris and members of both congregations. Rev. Julie Joefield Parris, Minister of Christian Education gave the feature address. The information which was discussed is as follows:

(1) *Acceptance – Children must know that they are loved by their parents*

- (2) *Parents role is to teach children about God, giving necessary guidance*
- (3) *Control and discipline*
- (4) *Recognition of children's accomplishments by parents showing love and praise*
- (5) *The home being the physical and emotional place of safety.*

Rev. Roslyn Hamblin, in making a presentation on the topic **"Teaching the Sunday School Class"** stated that teaching involved three aspects – (1) Preparation for lesson (this preparation is mainly of oneself), (2) Planning of lesson, and (3) Presentation of material. She also indicated that each lesson should be followed by an evaluation – whether formal or informal. All topics covered were quite informative. Before departing each participant received a copy of a Sunday School Manual and a copy of a Sunday School Curriculum Supplement. The workshop ended with prayer by Pastor David Ince.


### Conference Fish Fry

# Family Corner



## Bethlehem's First Confirmand

Palm Sunday is a traditional Confirmation date within the Moravian Church. However, for the new Fellowship, Bethlehem, in 1964, their zeal pushed them to have the first

Confirmation Service a week early. Having to 'borrow' a minister from another congregation for this purpose is likely the reason for the change in date. But the Confirmation Service was held with Palm Sunday in mind.

The first Confirmation Service had one confirmand. He was Winston Leroy Cumberbatch, still a member of the congregation today. Bro. Cumberbatch grew up in St. Joseph and attended the Cuthbert Pilgrim High School or Mt. Tabor High School, run at Mt. Tabor by the Rev. Cuthbert Pilgrim. He then served as a Public Health Inspector for St. Joseph. Upon marriage in August 1961, he moved to Christ Church.


When the Bethlehem congregation started in 1962, Bro Cumberbatch recalls being visited by Sis. Eloise Morrison and invited to join the church, then meeting at 'Bellehaven' on Enterprise Road. It was easy for him to accept this invitation since he was already familiar with the Moravian Church and Rev. Cuthbert Pilgrim through his secondary schooling. Both Bro. and Sis. Cumberbatch quickly became active in the life of the congregation, in both morning and evening Services and participating in the adult Sunday School class in the morning. Two afternoon Sunday School departments were established – one at Sayers Court and the other at Gall Hill. Bro. and Sis. Cumberbatch became teachers in the Sunday School being held at Sayers Court. He eventually became Superintendent of the combined Sunday School. She joined the Choir;

he offered himself for instruction for confirmation. The Confirmation Service took place on Sunday, March 15, 1964, officiated by Rev. Cuthbert Pilgrim, with the two attendant Helpers (now called Elders) being Bro. Damien Alleyne and Sis. Gladys Cain. Incidentally, Sis. Cumberbatch's Confirmation Service was on Palm Sunday the following year (April 11, 1965).

Bro. Cumberbatch recalls Rev. David Bratsch and then Rev. M. Errol Grant succeeding Rev. Pilgrim as pastor of the congregation. He also remembers Bro. Alban St. Hill and Bro. Luther Haynes as two lay preachers closely associated with the congregation. Three traditions of the congregation were the Single Sisters festival, the Lovefeast and Vacation Bible School. Some open-air services were held in the communities serviced by the church, especially Sayers Court and Gall Hill.

When Bro. Cumberbatch and his family migrated from Barbados in 1969, plans were being made for the purchase of land to build a church. They remained in touch with the congregation, sharing wherever they could, and providing the photograph of Rev. Cuthbert Pilgrim for the completed church hall dedicated to his memory. When Bro. Cumberbatch and his wife returned to reside in Barbados in 1999, they settled into the new church at Maxwell, and once more integrated themselves into the Bethlehem congregation. Bro. Cumberbatch offered himself as teacher of the adult Sunday School class and was appointed to the Board of Elders of the congregation. Today they continue to be dedicated members of the Bethlehem congregation, giving service to their God.




