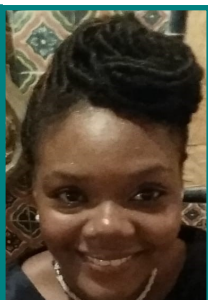

FROM THE PASTORS' DESK CONT'D

At an early age, I juggled among the Seventh Day Adventist (SDA) Church on a Saturday, Moravian Church on a Sunday morning and a Community Sunday School in the afternoon held at a villager's home, who was a member of the New Testament Church.

I remember telling my mom that I didn't want to go back to SDA but I visited the Community Sunday School a few times after. However, I felt the need as a child to remain and attend only the Cedar Hall Moravian Church.

Getting up at 5:00 am to clean the church with my grandmother, being part of Children's Fellowship, Youth Group, Junior Choir and Worship Team, entering Sunday School quizzes, leading worship and reading Scripture and countless Altar calls all formed my Christian Journey for the first 16 years of my life. However, I sensed there was more to this life and desired to go deeper. In 2004, at a Provincial Youth Camp (PYC) held in Tobago, I humbled myself and submitted, in full awareness, my life to God. For the last 15 years, I've chosen to remain rooted and grounded in God.

2. What has been your biggest challenge in this journey?

Reminding myself that I will make poor decisions from time to time. So don't be too hard on myself. Just get up, go back before God, repent and ask His forgiveness. Ensuring that I do not walk that road again.

3. As a young Christian, one can get distracted and stray. What has kept you focused on God and His Word?

Psalm 1:2-3 is a passage of Scripture I've personalized.

But my delight is in the law of the LORD; and in his law will I meditate day and night.

And I shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in the seasons; my leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever I do shall prosper.

I used to complain and ask God, "Why don't I have someone to call a best friend?"

"Why am I that person who's in the middle of the hierarchy; get along with both the popular people in school and with the not so popular?"

"Why don't I have many friends?"

I learnt that those years, and in certain contexts today, were His way of shielding me, moulding me, forming me and keeping me to Himself.

Over the years, my desire has always been to please God; stay in His presence by feeding my Spirit.

But I've also believed His promise in Psalm 37:4 and seen it come to pass many times:

"Delight yourself in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart."

4. At what point did you realise God had a higher calling for your life?

When I returned from PYC, I thought I'd return renewed and excited about the choice I had made. However my Pastor at the time, Rev. Nigel Daniel, asked me

to preach for Youth Sunday, as he also sensed the call for me to become a Pastor. I could hear the hearty laugh I bellowed in shock and disagreement with his outrageous request but he certainly got the last laugh. It soon became more than what Rev Nigel said...but what God was confirming constantly and I too sensed that I was being called to become a Pastor.

4. As the Associate Pastor, what can your congregation expect of you? What do you expect from them?

My congregation can expect me:

- To be open to learn.
- To be reliable and understanding.
- To seek God's wisdom in all that is required and walk in obedience.
- To be a team player.
- To walk in integrity
- To sing, dance and clap A LOT! ☺

I expect the following from them also:

- To be open to learn .
- To be understanding.
- To seek God's wisdom in all that is required and walk in obedience.
- To be open to my gifts.
- To be supportive .
- To be a team player.

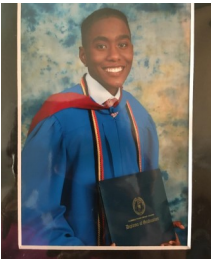

Congratulations on New Position

The PEC congratulates The Rev. Dr. Mikie Roberts, Provincial Director of Music; the Minister of Music for the Virgin Islands Conference and Associate Pastor of the Memorial Moravian Church in the Virgin Islands Conference, who has been selected to serve as **Programme Executive for Spiritual Life and Faith and Order for World Council of Churches (WCC) in Geneva, Switzerland, with effect from February 1, 2019.**

The WCC position was shared with all members of staff in the Province on February 16, 2018 and Rev. Dr. Roberts applied. After interviewing many candidates, he was found to be the most suitably qualified candidate. Consequently, The Rev. Dr. Mikie Roberts requested and has been granted secondment for period of four (4) years while he works for the WCC in Switzerland. That is, he will be on loan to the WCC from February 1, 2019 to January 31, 2023.

Synod Bulletin #2

The 32nd Provincial Synod of the Moravian Church Eastern West Indies Province will be held in Barbados from 12 to 19 July 2019 at the Duncan C. Moore Centre, Sharon, Barbados.

- All Members of Staff are expected to be in attendance at the Synod.
- Synodals will be expected to pay US \$850.00 per person.
- Members of the Moravian Church can begin to frame proposals to be forwarded to the Synod for consideration. Once considered and passed, they will become resolutions to guide the administration of the church. The proposals should be forwarded to the Superintendent of the Conferences.
- All Conferences are asked to have their proposals and Synod reports prepared and forwarded to the Provincial Headquarters no later than 01 March 2019. The reports will then be

duplicated, collated and forwarded to all Synodals via e-mail by 01 May 2019 to give persons an opportunity to read and digest the reports, so that our forward planning could be more informed and therefore more intentional.

- Observers who intend to be present at Synod are free to join in the discussion of any of the Synod Committees. Superintendents should seek to involve Observers in any activity the Conference delegation is involved in at Synod.
- Each Synodal will be placed on one Committee in an effort to expedite the business of the Synod and at the same time enable us to maximise the time allotted for the Synod. Please indicate your first, second and third choices for the Committee you believe your gifts would be most utilised. The PEC will place delegates based on the availability of space on the particular Committee.
