Are There Lessons we can Learn from the Life of John Hus?

On 06 July 2014, the Moravian Church worldwide reflected upon and memorialized the 599th anniversary of the martyrdom of John

Hus. He was a Bohemian religious reformer whose efforts to reform the church anticipated the Protestant Reformation.

Hus was born of nameless and unknown peasant parents in Husinec, in southern Bohemia, which is now the Czech Republic. His mother taught John to pray and, as he grew older, encouraged him to pursue a career as a priest.

Eventually he made his way to the University of Prague where he studied as a very poor student. Hus recounts his poverty while studying at the university in Prague. "When I was a hungry young student, I used to make a spoon out of bread in order to eat peas with it. Then I ate the spoon as well." In 1396 he received his Master of Arts degree. Two years later in 1398 he became a Lecturer in Theology at the university and in 1401 was made dean of its Philosophical Faculty.

Ordained a priest in 1400, in 1402 Hus took up additional duties as preacher at the Bethlehem Chapel, where the sermons were given in Czech instead of the traditional Latin.

The nationalist and church reformist movement that had been initiated by the popular 15th Century Bohemian preacher Jan Milic was prevalent at both the University and Bethlehem Chapel, and Hus quickly became involved in it. Before there was John Hus, there was Jan Milic.

In 1363 Milic renounced all his dignities to begin a life of extreme austerity. He also began to fearlessly denounce the vices of the clergy and the laity, which he was able to do in three languages. A gifted linguist, Jan Milic was able

A Godly Inheritance

In May we celebrated Mother's Day – a wonderful day to remember and in June we celebrated Father's Day. We spoke about what a Mother should be and how she should train her children. We spoke about how children should treat their mothers etc. On Mother's Day Eve I listened to one of my favorite Bible Teachers/Preachers – Dr Charles Stanley and I will share some of what he said with you. His topic was 'A Godly Inheritance'.

In 2nd Timothy 2:5 Paul says this of Timothy: "When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy Grandmother Lois, and thy Mother Eunice and I am persuaded that in thee also". This is truly a wonderful statement. All that Timothy's Grandmother and Mother had poured into him was clearly visible. What an inheritance, a treasure that neither moth nor rust doth corrupt and where thieves do not break through and steal.

We are all aware that when a parent dies, the children are looking for their inheritance – material inheritance. They fight about it, they fall out about it and some even "come to blows over it". In some instances these children were not even a helping force in their parent's life. Some of them were as we say "missing in action", but showed up just in time to claim what they consider to be rightfully theirs. However, there is a far better inheritance to leave for our children.

We are to:

Continually talk about God.

- To ensure that He becomes a part of their lives. Just as we tell them other things over and over, pour God into them.

Teach them to reverence God's Word.

- His Word answers life's questions.
- Make sure they own a Bible... that Bibles in your house are being used. God's Word is the most important information given to man.
- Tell them that they can't live a Godly life apart from God. Get in the Word with them. When questions arise, ask the Holy Spirit to help you with the answers.
- Teach them to respect God's Word.

They must gain an understanding of how to listen to God.

- We must listen first and teach them to listen (to be still before God) for His guidance.
- Look up Bible verses that show that God does not contradict Himself.

They must develop a pattern of obeying God.

- Obedience comes by submission.
- We must set the example of obedience (they watch us).

Teach them to develop a faith that conquers.

- Talk about what God has done in your life, how He has brought you through many situations.
- How He has answered prayers and how they must learn to pray

To have a forgiving heart.

- That guilt and un-forgiveness are a heavy loads to bear.
- That God forgives us daily.
- That Christ died for forgiveness of our sins;
- That forgiveness is often painful because we have been hurt in the process.
- They must see a forgiving spirit in us.
- That there are no 'BUTS' in God's forgiveness. In other words, "I will forgive you but....."

They must develop an orderly lifestyle.

- See you being orderly in the house;
- In your time keeping;
- In your finances; and
- Disorder brings confusion.

They must develop a servant's spirit.

- Ready to help others;
- See you being helpful and loving; and
- Making yourself available

They must be generous.

- See you being generous.
- Learn that there is no joy in being misers. The Word of God says "give and it shall be given unto you....". We can't out give God. No need to have much, just share what you have.

They must have sincere love.

- Not displaying fake love.
- Not giving things as a substitute for love.
- Make sure they feel love

PEC Reports

MORAVIAN CHURCH — UNITAS FRATRUM Office of the Unity Business Administrator

MESSAGE TO THE UNITY

To the members of the worldwide Moravian Church, we greet you in the name of Christ Jesus, our Lord and Chief Elder.

The Unity Board met in Kigoma, Tanzania, 6 to 11 May 2014, and we were welcomed by the Lake Tanganyika Province, which provided wonderful hospitality. Many of us arrived by way of Burundi, where the Moravians also welcomed us with great enthusiasm. We rejoice that our Saviour continues to bring growth to many provinces. The Moravian Church in Zambia, formerly a Mission Province, was received as a Unity Province. Burundi was recognized as a Mission Province, Iringa (Tanzania) and Eastern Congo are new Mission Areas, and Angola and Ruvumaince, Ruvuma---Njombe were recognized as Prospective Mission Areas.

As we listened to reports we had no doubt that Moravians continue the tradition of serving those often neglected by others. Provinces continue to minister to refugees, and in Africa some Provinces' present-day growth is a direct result of Moravian work during times of civil conflict and genocide. Around the Unity, congregations and provinces supplement what governments provide in education and health services. Social justice is a priority, especially confronting gender violence and caring for victims of HIV/AIDS.

Some provinces have business enterprises to provide employment and generate funds for mission, including several environmental projects. One province has an avocado project, another "Efforts in Trees." The delegate from South Africa made a special presentation to other delegates on how to establish effective business enterprises. And, of course, the Moravian Church Foundation reported of substantial income for theological education and projects from its many business enterprises.

Provinces continue to share leadership. A Czech Moravian serves in Peru, a Danish couple serve in the Democratic Republic of Congo, a Swiss volunteer is in Tanzania, and many youth are engaged in volunteer service, especially through the American provinces' "Antioch Servant" programme.

Are the Unity and its provinces facing difficulties as we expand our horizons in fulfilling the Great Commission of our Lord? Yes, just as individuals and congregations do. We rejoice in steps toward reconciliation brought about by the Holy Spirit in some areas (reconciliation is possible!) and we still wait for such steps in other areas. But often it is in our mistakes that we find God's guidance and grace. Furthermore, in the midst of difficult

conversations we as Unity Board members have found both mutual respect and mutual guidance.

We find great joy and privilege in our service and we remain in prayer for continued growth in numbers, ministry, and dedication to our Lord.

The hymn for the month of June is a new hymn that is not in the current hymnal. It is the hymn **You are Wonderful, You are Marvellous** and was written by Sister (Sis) Albertha Titus, a member of the Memorial Moravian congregation in Trinidad. Sis Titus has served the Moravian church at all levels: on her local congregational board, as Conference treasurer of the Trinidad Conference and as a member of the Provincial Elders Conference.

This hymn was penned in 2009 and captures the nature and character of God. It extols the magnificence of God pointing to the beauty of creation as evidence of God's matchless power. As we sing this new hymn with its simple melody we are reminded just how excellent, wonderful and awesome is our God. Throughout this hymn we are made to reflect not only on the greatness of God, to which nothing can be compared, but also to recognize that in all of creation, ourselves included, God's hand is at work. This hymn expresses the sentiment of the Psalmist who declared in Psalm 139: 14, ***"I will give thanks to You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; Wonderful are Your works, And my soul knows it very well."***

Synod Bulletin #1

Hosting of the 31st Provincial Synod

The 31st Provincial Synod of the Moravian Church Eastern West Indies Province will be held in Antigua from 10 to 17 July 2015 at the Jolly Beach Resort and Spa. The Resort is an all-inclusive Hotel.

- All Members of Staff are expected to be in attendance at the Synod.
- All Conferences are asked to have their delegates elected and the names forwarded to the Provincial Headquarters no later than 28 February 2015.
- Delegates will be required to pay US\$570.00 per person for the Synod, while Observers will be required to pay US\$700.00 per person.
- Children 3 to 11 years can stay in a room with 2 adults for US \$66.00 per person per night. Children 0 to 2 stay free of charge.
- Members of the Moravian Church can begin to frame proposals to forward to Synod for consideration. Once considered and passed, they will become resolutions to guide the administration of the church.
- All Conferences are asked to have their Synod reports prepared and forwarded to the Provincial Headquarters no later than 01 March 2015. The reports will then be duplicated, collated and forwarded to all delegates via email by 01 May 2015, to give persons an opportunity to read and digest the reports, so that our forward planning could be more informed and therefore more intentional. Delegates will collect the hard copy of the reports in booklet form upon arrival in Antigua.

The Provincial Youth Camp will be held in Barbados from 10 to 17 July 2014. Let us remember our young people in our prayers as they prepare for the Provincial Youth Camp.

Unforgettable! Indeed, there is no better word to describe my experience here at UTCWI during these past four years. Both my academic achievements and formation witness to this fact; but all this was not without challenges.

Academically, I thank God for enabling me to graduate with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Theology from the University of the West Indies (UWI) and Diploma in Ministerial Studies from UTCWI. It has not always been easy, especially as I sought to balance studies with family life, carry on my music ministry, and deal with denominational activities at the same time. I am glad I was able to complete the programme required by the Church in a timely manner. Praise God! In the same breath, I am particularly grateful for all members of the Faculty and Staff and other lecturers who have impacted my life in various ways. St. Christopher Outreach Centre

The St. Christopher Outreach Centre, located on the Irish Town Bay Road, was established in July 2010. It provides hot meals to the underprivileged, particularly the homeless and shut-ins for five days of the week (Mondays to Fridays). It also provides counseling to the mentally ill, as well as a shower and clean clothing when needed.

The Centre is the brainchild of Mr Kishu Chandiramani, proprietor, RAM's group of companies, and is managed in partnership with the St. Kitts Christian Council and the St. Kitts-Nevis-Anguilla National Bank Ltd. Mr Chandiramani, now deceased (June 2014), provided the facility, equipment, utensils and other supplies, including food items weekly for cooking. Food supplies are also funded by the St. Kitts-Nevis-Anguilla National Bank Ltd and other local patrons who provide vegetables and other supplies, including bread on a weekly basis. The Council is responsible for meeting the wages of the cooks, as well as the cost of gas and electricity and for providing volunteers to assist with the serving and distribution of meals. There is a Steering and Operating Committee, comprising representatives from the Anglican, Catholic, Methodist and Moravian churches, the RAMS group of companies and the St. Kitts-Nevis-Anguilla National Bank to assist with the overall management of the Centre

The Centre is a very worthwhile and rewarding venture. Volunteers get an opportunity to serve, to reach out to the underprivileged, the homeless, the lonely and depressed in our society and to make a difference in someone's life.

Reach Out to Out Reach

The major purpose of the Outreach Centre is the feeding of these needy persons who may be without at least one proper daily

meal. The Christian Council of Churches was sought to assist in this major undertaking. The following Churches – Catholic, Methodist, Anglican, and Moravian - opted to assist in the undertaking, which would be and is a cost to them.

The food, which is supplied by Ram's Supermarket, is prepared by three individuals while help in serving the walk-ins is provided by volunteers during the week of their church assignments. Each church has submitted the names of those needy shut-ins whereby deliveries to them are also done through volunteers from each church. A schedule of individual churches is sent out regularly to Council representatives which indicates the weeks of the various Church assignments. A copy is also posted on Moravian's bulletin board.

Contributions from the churches go toward the payment of staff salaries, Social Security contributions and utility bills. Individual contributions towards this endeavour would be greatly appreciated by Zion!

Presently Zion has volunteers who make the daily deliveries to the shut-ins, and volunteers who, when able and needed, fill in for the regulars. We are aware that there are persons who would like to donate at least two hours per day, (during our week of service) but are full time employees and are unable to take that time from their employment. Consequently we are still in need of volunteers who can assist and serve at the Centre.

If you are willing and able to give some time please let the Church Office know.

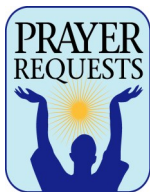

Confirmation Class will commence in September once there is the available resources and all forms are returned to the Church's Office.

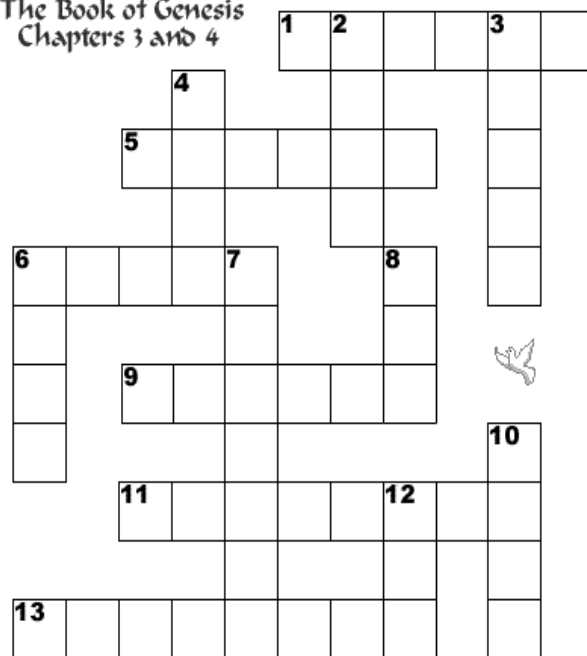

Zion Youth Fest 2014

Summer vacation is almost here and schools are winding down in preparation for the summer vacation. Many children are excited as they are poised in anticipation of their annual overseas vacation trips, community/sports youth camps and other fun-filled activities. However, it must be noted although summer is a time of sun, fun and relaxation for our youths, God's work and Youth Ministry do not take a sabbatical during summer months. This is why we here at Zion are making our final plans to host our 6th Annual Zion Moravian Church Summer Youth Festival: a unique three-week programme of evangelism, fellowship opportunities and fun.

Over the last three years, Zion Youth Fest has been condensed to three weeks instead of one month of activities involving one week of Vacation Bible School, one week of evangelism, skills activities and excursions and one week of camp. Zion Youth Fest 2014 will be launched on Sunday 13 July 2014, and continues for three weeks and concludes on 05 August 2014. Our Thematic Focus is **"Focused, Ready, Determined: I Dare to be Different"**. The proposed theme for this year, although all encompassing, is personal and designed to challenge our youth to be different, step out from the norm and capture the "road less travelled" experience. The objectives for this year's programme are:

Once again the Committee will be seeking the assistance of members to contribute in making this year's fest a success. Members, we welcome donations in cash, kind and prayers, as well as persons seeking to volunteer their time to this worthy venture. Please do not hesitate to contact the Church's office if you are in a position to assist or contribute in any way possible. Your investment in our youths is a positive investment in a better church, community and nation. Remember God loves a cheerful giver and He returns His blessings to us.

to preach in Latin, the Czech language and German. Hus was influenced by the convictions of Milic.

Also influential on Hus at this time were the ideas of John Wycliffe. Shortly before the appointment of Hus to the Bethlehem Chapel the influence of the English reformer John Wycliffe came to Bohemia through Czech students who had studied at Oxford. Hus found in Wycliffe (1330-1384) an intellectual framework for the practical ideas of the Czech reform movement. "Wycliffe, Wycliffe" he wrote in the margin of a manuscript, "you will turn many heads."

Hus, like Wycliffe, vigorously condemned the sale of indulgences, which gave individuals freedom to sin without guilt or shame. Hus declared it was wrong for the pope to pay for his war against the King of Naples in 1412 by selling pardon for sin. Pope John XXIII claimed that

indulgences were a shortcut way into the kingdom of heaven. Hus said the practice supported brothels, taverns and supplied girlfriends for the priests. In the area of church doctrine both Wycliffe and Hus believed in:

- Predestination, whereby God chooses who will come to faith from the beginning;
- The Bible as the ultimate religious authority in matters of faith and practice; and

They maintained that Christ, rather than any corrupt ecclesiastical official is the true head of the church.
